International Course in Monaco Princess Grace Hospital, 21-23 February 2019

The MRMI Course (Medical Response to Major Incidents) is a **training based on simulation of the health response to major incidents (exceptional situation)**. This training was created in 2009 by a committee of international experts under the aegis of ESTES (European Society for Trauma and Emergency Surgery) and at the initiative of Prof. Sten LENNQUIST.

This training uses the MACSIM^{®1} simulation tool based on magnets that can be positioned on whiteboards. More than 600 victim records (created from real patient records) are available for the simulation exercises. The **entire emergency and medical care chain** (from the scene to the post-operative and intensive care units) as well as the **entire chain of command with the interservice linkages** are tested. Short exercises, limited to one or two segments of the chain are also possible.

In order to be able to introduce a very large number of professionals from different professions, belonging to different services, and with a view of harmonization and improvement of practices to the health response to a situation of major incident, four French scientific societies² have decided to combine their efforts to deploy this internationally recognized training. This training complements but does not replace the training currently offered to various health and rescue professionals. We hope that the MRMI trainings allow enriching and cordial exchanges between the participants of the different services from different countries.

The MRMI course offers each individual the opportunity to learn how to improve his/her ability to respond and react to the current threat.

The International Course in Monaco (in French and English) from February 21 to 23, 2019, organized by MRMI-France, will be hosted at the Princess Grace Hospital, at the Nursing School.

The MRMI course is referenced by the French National Agency for Continuing Professional Development.
